29 Pursuant to the Case Resolution Stipulation (Doc. 133), ¶ 19, defendant the State
30 of Arizona (the “State”) hereby submits to the National Association of the Deaf and the
31 Arizona Center for Disability Law its second report identifying the PSAPs within the
32 State, but outside the Maricopa Region, that have implemented or plan to implement
33 Text-to-911 Services.

34 Text-to-911 funding applications have been submitted by thirty-five PSAPs from
35 eight counties (including Maricopa County for DPS Phoenix). The total amount of
36 funding approved for these thirty-five PSAPs is \$761,900.
